MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2022-2023

INTRODUCTION

This modern slavery and human trafficking statement is made on behalf of Restitute pursuant to section 54(1) Modern Slavery Act 2015.

OUR BUSINESS

Is a Community Interest Company supporting 3rd party victims of crime and operates within the UK only

OUR SUPPLY CHAINS

We use sub-contractors and suppliers to purchase items for clients, to provide services to clients such as gardening, house-cleaning, small building projects and therapeutic services.

OUR POLICIES AND CONTROLS

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES

We use local suppliers known to Restitute and who have been recommended to us by other VCSE and healthcare organisations as well as local people. We use small independent suppliers for house-cleaning where the owner is also the operator wherever possible. Due to the sensitive nature of our work, we need to know who is visiting clients' homes. We use local owner operator suppliers for printing and stationery. Where we need to use national or international suppliers, we use companies with their own Modern Slavery procedures. Our accounts are audited independently.

RISK MANAGEMENT AND ASSESSMENT OF EFFECTIVENESS

Our procurement procedures ensure that our procurement is managed by people who are conversant with Modern Slavery risks. Where engaging new suppliers we ensure, as far as possible that they adhere to Modern Slavery. We operate in a low risk environment where our procurement is largely from UK suppliers and where it is for international suppliers, this is for IT and software services. Our biggest risk is potentially from people supplying home services and are mitigated by using owner operated businesses or sole-traders.

TRAINING

Staff are inducted into procurement procedures and all purchases / procurement are purchased through a central team who are trained to identify risks associated with Modern Slavery.
